TECH TOOLS SPOTLIGHT

AIR SKETCH

Air Sketch turns your iPad into a wireless whiteboard, allowing you to annotate PDFs and images live, without being stuck behind the podium. Using an IP address entered into your web browser, you can project your live annotations during class. There is nothing to install on the computer; you will just need to use Firefox or Chrome as your browser.

There are two versions of Air Sketch available in the iTunes store. The free version allows for a whiteboard screen to annotate on and project through the web browser. SHOWME

ShowMe allows you to turn your iPad into an interactive whiteboard. ShowMe allows voice recording over whiteboard tutorials and the capability to share online.

With ShowMe, you can draw Khan-Academy-style lessons to present content. You can also take a screenshot of text or photos and use as that image within ShowMe.
