FAVORITE TEACHING TOOL SPOTLIGHT

These are the favorite teaching tools that you sent in:



DR. TED SONG — My favorite teaching tools are white board and markers. They help the class to interact with the instructor, and the instructor is easily able to change the speed of the lecture according to students' understandings. One additional teaching tool is Blackboard discussion; students could share their ideas online apart from class time, which could enhance students' learning.



DR. TIM GILMOUR — My favorite teaching tool is the overhead LCD projector. It allows me to project PowerPoint lectures for my class. Other favorite tools are the ELMO camera device, my laser pointer, my scanner (for getting diagrams from textbooks for my PowerPoints), our copier/ scanner machine, MATLAB software, the TurningPoint remote clicker response system, and the wireless slide advancer remote.



DR. TIM WAKEFIELD — My favorite teaching tool is the IF-AT form supplied by Epstein Educational Enterprises. This is a paper form with a series of 50 scratch-off multiple choice answers. Under one of the answers is a star indicating a correct answer. I use this form in multiple classes as a way of assessing learning. For example, I'll put a series of Anatomy-related multiple-choice questions on the screen using PowerPoint. The students work together

to answer the question, then scratch off their guess to see if it is correct. But even if they are wrong they get to keep working because there are still three more choices. This activity makes the assessment fun, and it also builds camaraderie amongst the students in my class.
