BLACKBOARD DISCUSSION BOARDS

The discussion boards in Blackboard are an easy tool to use to increase student engagement in online and on ground courses. TAKING ONLINE ATTENDANCE IN BLACKBOARD

Blackboard has an online attendance module, which makes taking attendance easy, whether teaching online or on ground. Setting up online attendance takes just a few easy steps:

- 1. Access your course in Blackboard.
- 2. Click on Course Tools under the Control Panel.
- 3. Choose Online Attendance.
- 4. Click on Dates SetUp.
- 5. Identify the dates when your course begins and ends.
- 6. Choose the day(s) of the week your class meets.
- 7. Check Hide Non-Students (if you have TAs or other non-students enrolled in your course).
- 8. Click Save Settings.

Once your Online Attendance is set up, you just access the link each class meeting, take attendance for that date, and click Save Attendance. To see more details, view <u>these instructions</u>.
